This meeting was arranged to discuss the training opportunities currently available across Dorset Council, BCP Council and the CCG. Are the providers already known suitable or the most appropriate training providers.

There was discussion from procurement officers if there was merit in going off framework to open tender bids from the whole market.

Need to ensure that providers are aware that training needs to be coproduced and co-delivered with those with lived experience. This will be written into the tender.

There was a question and discussion (again from procurement officers) about which LA would take the lead on this. They discussed the various processes they use – Edge and Salisbury Dynamic Purchasing System and Pro Contract. It was decided that whichever LA had the most providers on their framework.

Action is for Rachel & Melissa (procurement) to talk to their colleagues in respective Las to discuss how this will be opened up to the wider market – there could be a fantastic small provider out their who has not previously registered on either framework.

They will word the evaluation criteria – 70/30 on quality or 50/50 split. Also discussed merit of stating existing budget is £83K. What can be delivered for this, then evaluation would focus 100% on quality of training provided. This is for level 2 & 3 training. The next steps would be to build a business case for future funding to sustain this training.
