The project will be overseen by Brian, Melissa and Tammi.

Workstreams to include delivery of PBS training, there will be a multi agency review to ensure PBS training is as expected – led by Tammi Grainger.

There will be info and guidance resources available, but not yet sure where portal will sit, either with one or other (or both councils) or with Challenging Behaviour organisation.

There will be 2 Advisory Groups 1 for Parents and Carers, and another one for providers. I member from each advisory group will report to the oversight group.

Question: PBS for those with LD & ASD – what if individual has ASD but no LD, also is it suitable for those with mental health issues (ASD diagnosed). Brian thought it would be suitable, we suggested he read the BILD report.

Question: what age range is this aimed at. Thinking is most suitable for 14+, would need to be adapted for younger.

Is training just for professionals? They are looking at offering training sessiona for parents as well.

DPCC previously worked with PBS to deliver this training to parents co-delivered with ID Camhs. They covered everything in 2 full days (4 hr sessions).





Brian: looking at delivering this in 3 short sessions with detail on which session will cover which topics.

We asked if training provider could co-deliver this with parents with lived experience. That is something that can go into the market statement.

We asked if this would incorporate some of the Oliver McGowan training, it is something to consider.

There will be a procurement panel (lengthy piece of work – if procurement for ASD training is anything to go by. This may be even longer – a hefty commitment. Shortlisting and evaluating providers).

This group will meet every 2 months – next meeting will be 8th August approx 1.5 hrs from 4pm.
